International Flower Festival, Sikkim

May is a very exuberant time in India! Come to India in May and take part in events filled with lights, music and dance.

Sikkim has become the most famous tourist attraction because of its beautiful hill station lying in the lower Himalayas. The International Flower Festival is an annual event that is held in Gangtok, the capital of Sikkim. The 2015 flower festival will be held from 1st May to 30th May, in the premises of the Governor's residence.

A rare show of exotic varieties of flowers, orchids and other plants native to Sikkim, a north east state. Held every summer during the peak flowering season, this is a spectacular event attracting people from all over India. The tiny state of Sikkim, famous for its flora which is in full bloom during March-May has around 600 species of orchids, 240 species of trees and ferns, 150 varieties of gladioli, 46 types of rhododendrons along with a variety of magnolias and many other foliage plants. The main displays in the flower show are orchids, gladioli, roses, cacti, alpine plants, creepers, climbers, ferns, herbs etc. If you love adventures and wading through waters, then there is river rafting for you. Another interesting feature of the Flower festival in Sikkim is the Yak Safari.

Gangtok History

In the state of Sikkim, most towns including the popular ones lack proper historical details and so does Gangtok. There isn't anything much known about the town's history. However, the earliest record date that talks about the existence of Gangtok is the year 1716 which happens to be the year of construction of the Hermitic Gangtok Monastery. Until the construction of the famous Enchey Monastery in the town, Gangtok continued to remain quite unexplored. However, its importance began rising with the place being declared Sikkim's capital in the year 1894. Gangtok has witnessed some disasters and landslides of which the one that took place in 1977 happened to be the biggest. In this about 38 were killed and various buildings were destroyed.

Arrival Information

By Air : The nearest airport is Bagdogra near Siliguri, which is at a distance of 124 km from Gangtok. The taxi fare from the airport to Gangtok is about Rs 2,000. This airport is connected to Kolkata, Delhi and Guwahati. International travelers can get connecting flights from Kolkata or Delhi. Both are well connected with many cities in India and abroad. Helicopter services are available from Bagdogra to Gangtok, only once during a day. It takes about 20 minutes to cover one way journey and cost Rs 3,000 per person.

By Train : The nearest rail is New Jalpaiguri, which is nearly 148 km away from Gangtok. Taxi cab will charge about Rs 2,000. This is well connected to most of the major cities in India.

By Bus : The Gangtok city is well connected to other cities in Sikkim and the neighboring states by bus services. Private tourist buses are available from Gangtok to Bagdogra (124 km, Rs 600) and to Siliguri (114 km, Rs 500).

Getting Around : Taxis play routes around the city, and there are standard charges within the main areas. For a private service cost according to the distance and Rs 150 for a Share taxis are available within the city and costs 15-20 INR per person.

NB: Taxis can only be hailed from designated taxi stands which are generally after each km within city limits. Sightseeing places in and around Gangtok.

Top 10 Places to See in Gangtok

- **Tsomgo Lake** : Tsomgo Lake (Changu lake), is about 1 km. Long, oval in shape, 15 meters deep and is considered sacred by the local people. From Nathula Pass, one can see deep into Chinese territory, which is dotted with sky touching peaks covered with snow. After a 2000 feet downhill, there is a splendid blue water lake called Changu Lake.
- **Kanchenjunga Mountain**: Kangchenjunga is that the third highest mountain in the world. It rises with an elevation of 8,586 m (28,169 ft) in a section of the Himalayas known as Kangchenjunga Himal that is restricted in the west by the Tamur river and in the east by the Teesta river.
- **Nathula Pass** : Nathula Pass is a mountain pass on the Indo-Chinese border that is the trade link between India and China in eastern Sikkim, Nathula Pass nestles at an elevation of fourteen, 140 feet and ranks amongst the highest passes accessible by tourists via motorable road.
- **Ganesh Tok** : Ganesh Tok offers the bird's eye view of sprawling Gangtok city, whereas across the hills Mt. Khangchendzonga and Mt. Siniolchu loom over the horizon.

- [Tashi Viewpoint](#) : Tashi view point offers the guests excellent view of the alternative hills, besides mount mountain peak.
- [Hanuman Tok](#) : Hanuman Tok in Sikkim itself provides fantastic photographic views of the Khangcendzonga. The covering mountain peaks look heavenly from this temple.
- [Ban Jhakri Falls](#) : Ban Jhakri Falls Energy Park, lies amidst a lush inexperienced valley cover two acres, encircled by trees and a gushing mountain watercourse.
- [Enchey Monastery](#) : Enchey Monastery is one in all the most vital monasteries of Sikkim.
- [Pemayangtse Monastery](#) : Pemayangtse cloister (Monastery) is one in every of the foremost famed pilgrimage centres.
- [Rumtek Monastery](#) : Rumtek is a notable cloister (Monastery), all over the globe, especially among the Tibetan Buddhists, and is set near Gangtok, the capital of geographic area. Originally known as the Dharma Chakra Centre, it includes a gorgeous shrine temple and a cloister for the monks.



Nightlife in Gangtok

Although Gangtok Hill town is quite small, there are numerous options here for night outs including pubs, bars, casinos, music and night clubs. You will be surprised to know that the first land based live casino in India was set up in Gangtok.

- **Cafe Live & Loud** : A Great Music Club: live & loud at night with well known bands playing music of all sorts and people enjoying drinks and dancing away till mid night. Capacity here is 100. The area has dedicated stage and quality sound systems with in-house sound engineer. Most impressive here is the over all interior decor, colorful ambience and the excellent graffiti on the ceiling.
- **Pub 25** : Located at the New Market area of MG Marg, PUB 25 is a great place to chill, drink, listen to some good music and have good food at reasonable prices. In fact drinks are cheaper than several other places in the area. It's a traditional British style pub with excellent interior decors and ambience, and spread across two floors. The bar is well stocked.
- **Night clubs** : X'cape is probably the most popular nightclub in Gangtok and located at the Vajra Cinema Hall. Great music and dance floor combined with great selections of wine & spirits plus good food. You will mostly find Gangtok's young crowd here.

What to Buy in Gangtok

Gangtok offers an unique shopping experience. Shopping primarily revolves round its predominant Buddhist culture and the cold weather. The Thangkas (traditional paintings on cotton canvas and silk frames) is quite a rage. And so are the exquisite Choksee tables designed in Tibetan style. The traditional Tibetan and Sikkimese garments are also quite popular. While some of the tourists buy these garments, the rest wear these garments and take pictures of themselves in it. Since Sikkim has chilly to cold weather round the year, the tourists throng for the woollen gear. The woollen blankets, carpets, sweaters, jackets, ski caps, mufflers and shawls draw a lot of attention.

- **Lal Bazar** : Lal Bazar as numerous curio or souvenir shops. They are spread all over Gangtok. We explored as we had to buy many souvenir and gifts for our friends. We found M.G.Shops are very very expensive and dont' encourage bargain at all.
- **Kandoika on M.G.Road** : This shop is very famous for Tibetan curios and Sikkimese curios. But I found the prices are very expensive. The shopkeeper is also not ready for bargain. Since, he has probably largest collection and located on main M.G.Road, he has good business. You may try for yourself and also do some bargaining, he may concede to the request.

What to Eat in Gangtok

Gangtok is home to almost everything that the cuisine of this area has to offer in its most rich, splendid, authentic form with a flattering variety of options. What is impossible to miss in Gangtok includes Momos, Thukpa, Wonton, Gyathuk, Thenthuk and more, along with a Sikkim style meat patty called Shah-Phaley. Along with this you get to choose from a huge variety of authentic soups almost unique to the area. Chang is a locally made alcoholic beverage and is a must try while here. Authentic Tibetan and Indo-Chinese cuisines are also available in the restaurants and must also be tried.

Sikkim - Special cuisine : Sikkim is a subtle and natural blend of everything in and around. The cuisine here follows pretty much the same pattern as it derives its flavors ingredients, styles and elements from Nepal, Bhutan, Tibet and India, together. Sikkim's Cuisine, hence, draws inspiration from all that's around and the numerous cultures and religions that it, itself fosters to give you a cuisine that is authentic and defining to the area.

While staple items of the cuisine are Momos, Thukpa and a local beer 'Chang', fermented foods are popular given the natural conditions. Rice is almost essential in each meal. Add to it a dash of authentic and splendid soups, pickles and handful of meat and vegetable delicacies and you get the colourful and tasteful cuisine of Sikkim.



Sydney, History

Ancient History :

Before the arrival of Europeans, New South Wales had been inhabited for many thousands of years by Aboriginal people. Aboriginal Australia comprises up to 300 Aboriginal nation-states, speaking more than 250 languages and many more dialects. As hunter-gatherers, Aboriginal people developed a profound relationship with the land they inhabited, and a unique knowledge of its plants and animals. By the time the British arrived in Sydney in January 1788, there were more than 1500 Aboriginal people belonging to many clans living in the area from Botany Bay to Broken Bay and as far west as Parramatta.

Europeans settled after Sydney was chosen as a penal colony for prisoners shipped out from the overflowing jails of England. Two decades later, Governor Lachlan Macquarie charted a new course for New South Wales, the first state of Australia, as a society of free men and women. At about the same time, it was discovered that the broad plains of New South Wales were eminently suitable for the production of fine merino wool, and the country's economic future was assured.

Arrival Information

By Air : The Sydney Kingsford Smith International Airport located 10 km south of the city is the gateway to Sydney. It is the busiest airport of the country, so delays and snafus are often the lot of the travellers. It is also the oldest commercial airport in the world and has three terminals. The airport is used for both international and domestic purpose. Most international airlines fly to Sydney.

By Train : Sydney is well connected by rail to Canberra, Melbourne, Brisbane and Adelaide. There are railway links (Ghan and Indian-Pacific) between New South Wales and Perth, Alice Springs and Adelaide as well. Many trains and buses from the Central Station in Sydney are operated by government's Countrylink.

By Bus : Private as well as government run buses link Sydney, New South Wales to other parts of the country and most of these buses arrive at Sydney Coach Terminal. All buses and coaches are equipped with safety and comfort features to make your travel as convenient as possible.

Getting Around : Sydney is served by an extensive system of public transport which consists of rail, light and mono, buses, ferries and taxis. They connect almost all parts of the city to the suburbs.

Top 10 Places to See in Sydney

- **Sydney Opera House** : Perched on the waterfront of Bennelong Point, the Sydney Opera House is one of the world's most famous buildings. Designed by Danish architect Jørn Utzon, the structure's sloping white roofs make the performing arts center appear as if it's a giant ship setting out to sea.
- **Bondi Beach** : Bondi Beach is a mile-long sweep of golden sand lined with red-tile-roofed homes, apartments and green spaces. A promenade adjacent to the sand runs the length of the crescent-shaped beach.
- **Queen Victoria Building** : The Queen Victoria Building is a five-story shopping center that fills an entire city block and houses nearly 200 retailers. Built by architect George McRae in 1898, the building was designed as a marketplace and concert hall.
- **Sydney Tower** : Soaring 1,073 feet above sea level, the Sydney Tower is the city's tallest structure, offering 360-degree views of the compact metropolis, harbor and surrounding countryside.
- **Sydney Harbour Bridge** : The iconic Sydney Harbour Bridge is both the main method of crossing the harbor and a travel destination for adventurous visitors. Completed in 1932, the bridge features an arch that stands 134 meters (440 feet) above sea level and spans 503 meters (1,654 feet).

- **Darling Harbour** : Darling Harbour was redeveloped during the 1980s with culture and tourism in mind. Situated immediately adjacent to the Central Business District, the neighborhood is now home to some of the most popular tourist attractions in Sydney.
- **Royal Botanic Gardens** : Royal Botanic Gardens is wedged between the Sydney Opera House and The Domain public green space. Overlooking the harbor, the urban park contains more than 7,500 species of plants, many of which are native to Australia.
- **The Rocks** : The Rocks is the city's oldest neighborhood. Named after its rocky shore, The Rocks was Australia's first permanent European settlement and the place where the country's convict history began.
- **Australian National Maritime Museum** : The premier attraction in Sydney's recently redeveloped Darling Harbour, the Australian National Maritime Museum is best known for its historic seafaring vessels.
- **Taronga Zoo** : Taronga Zoo gives visitors a close-up view of Australia's indigenous creatures as well as animals from all over the world. Highlights include the zoo's Roar and Snore experience, which lets visitors stay overnight to observe nocturnal fauna.
